Youth Tobacco Use & Public Health

WI Wins Background

Synar Amendment

- ~ 1992 federal law
- ~ Requires states to enforce laws prohibiting the sales of tobacco to minors
- ~ States must keep their illegal sales rate under 20% to receive Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant (SABG)

WI State Statutes 134.66 & 254.916

- ~ Shortly after the Synar Amendment WI abided w/ state laws
- ~ 134.66 prohibits sales to minors & enforces education
- ~ 254.916 gives the state the right to investigate tobacco retailers or conduct compliance checks



- ~ In 2001 WI illegal sales rate was 33.7%
- ~ In 2002 the WI Wins Program was implemented
- ~ The program is based off of positive reinforcement & includes inspections, media outreach, & public outreach

Tobacco Prevention & Control Program (TPCP)

- ~ Offers tobacco cessation resources
- ~ Offers youth tobacco prevention programs (WI Wins)
- ~ Provides support to local efforts
- ~ Generates reports & data sheets

15 Tobacco Free Coalitions



WRAP

- ~ Allows TPCP to uniformly collect retail data on tobacco, alcohol, and nutrition
- ~ Tobacco assessments occur every year
- ~ Coalitions have the option to also assess alcohol and nutrition products, placement, and advertising

Alcohol is more available and is advertised more than tobacco




WI youth are legally allowed to go to the bar with their parents at any age and have a drink



WRAP in Juneau County



- ~ High prevalence of e-cigs, especially flavored
- ~ Alcohol sometimes located within 12 inches of toys, candy, or gum
- ~ Alcohol located within 3 feet of the floor and at aisle ends
- ~ Alcohol located next to soda in almost every convenience store

Juneau County: Alcohol Compliance Checks

Substance Abuse Free Environment (SAFE) in Juneau County Coalition



4 18-19 year old participants

2 county detectives

40 retailers



- ~ 80% compliance rate overall (32 of 40)
- ~ Sellers ranged in age, outlet type, gender, and municipality
- ~ 2 retailers did not ID



Barron County Tobacco Compliance Checks

- ~ Barron, Polk, Rusk, Pierce, La Croix, and Burnett Counties
- ~ Multi-jurisdiction coalition working towards tobacco prevention





- ~ Western Wisconsin Working for Tobacco Free Living
- ~ Tobacco prevention and control
- Maintain state and local tobacco control efforts

- ~ WI WINS campaign
- ~ State level initiative put in place to decrease youth access to tobacco products
- ~ 40 compliance checks
- ~ 2 youth inspectors
- ~ Local law enforcement presence



Counter Tools Store Auditing in Barron County



Partnered with Polk County to conduct 10 counter tools assessments



- ~ Facilitates local- and state-level policy changes affecting the retail environment
- ~ Measures tobacco, food, and alcohol product availability, pricing, placement, promotions and marketing in retail environments
- ~ First step towards building awareness and educating for change

Polk County: WRAP Assessment

Burnett and Polk Counties: 10 assessments each

Collaboration with Barron County: 5 assessments

Collaboration with business owners to get permission to assess their establishment

Findings:

- Most establishments good at keeping tobacco behind counter
- ~ Large bags of pipe tobacco
- ~ Alcohol displayed in very easy to see places
- Not many fresh fruit/vegetable options



Polk County: WI Wins Tobacco Compliance Checks

Responsible for doing checks in 3 counties

Burnett: 29

Polk: 62

St. Croix: 77

Findings:

- ~ All but 1 place checked ID & still sold
- ~ Confusion with reading new IDs
- ~ Polk County sales went up from last year

- ~ Educate and increase awareness of traditional tobacco use


Current Collaborations in Youth Alcohol Use



- ~ Under Wisconsin DHS oversight and funding
- ~ Main goal is to support positive youth development
- ~ Provides support to substance abuse prevention coalitions (more than 90) through 5 regional prevention centers
- ~ Hosts biannual regional meetings for coalitions
- ~ Advocates for substance abuse prevention at the local, state, and national levels



Opportunities for Future Collaborations



- ~ Address increasing prevalence of Juuls and other flavored nicotine products in communities (local and state levels)
- ~ Communities help each other write/amend tobacco- and nicotine-free school policies
- ~ Work with national tobacco-free organizations to promote new anti-tobacco policies at the state level



- ~ Create an alcohol-specific organization at the state level (similar to TPCP) and alcohol-specific coalitions
- ~ Consider creating a more positive alcohol environment at a state level
- ~ Address the acceptability, availability, affordability, and attractiveness of alcohol (per WI DHS recommendations)
