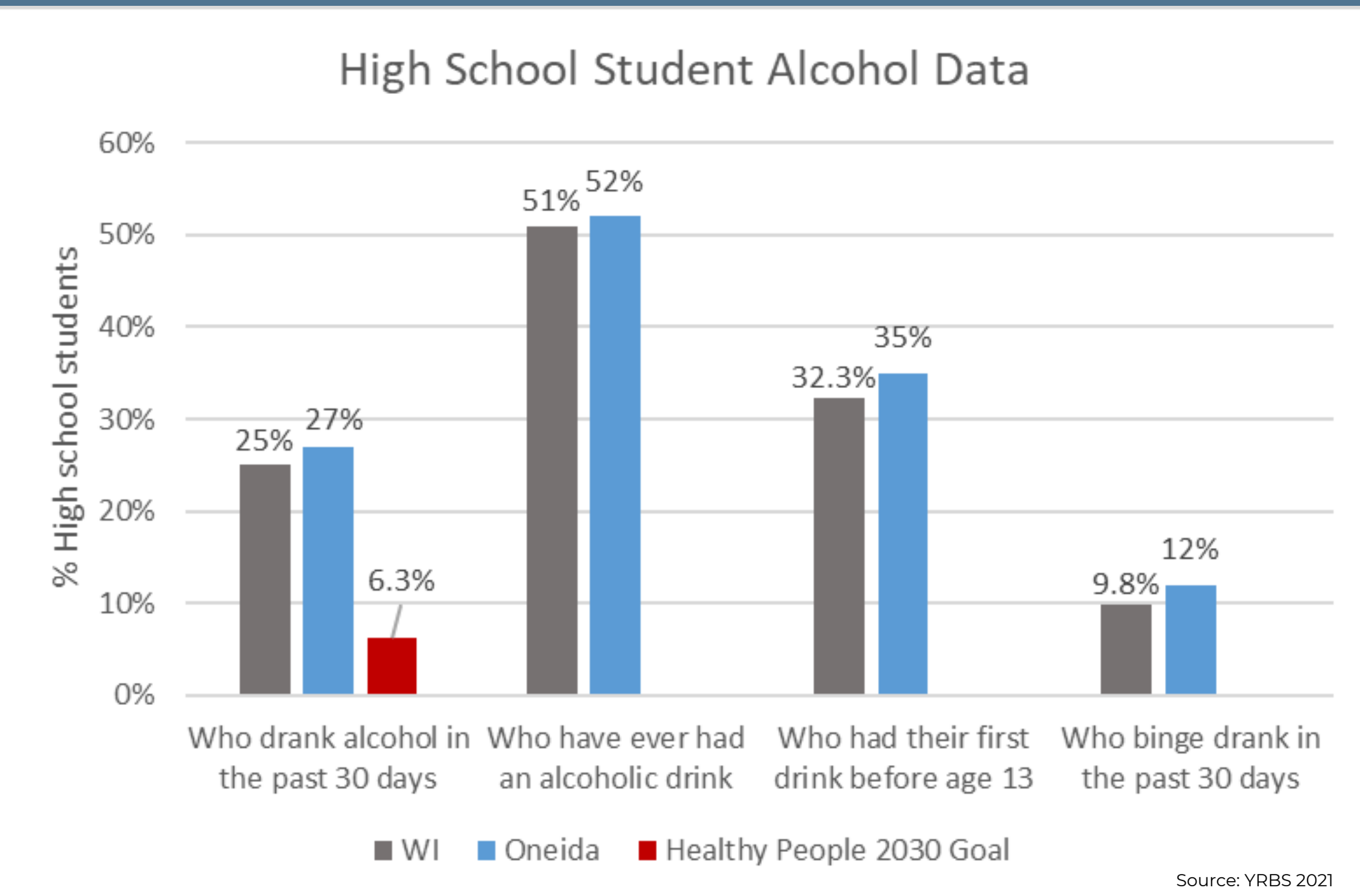

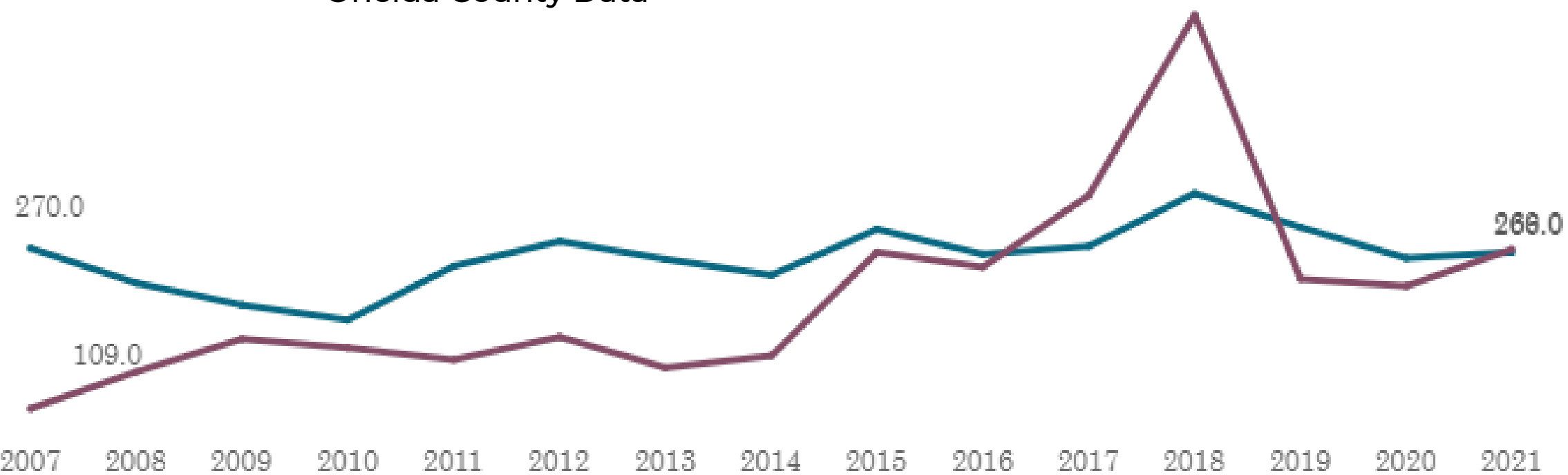

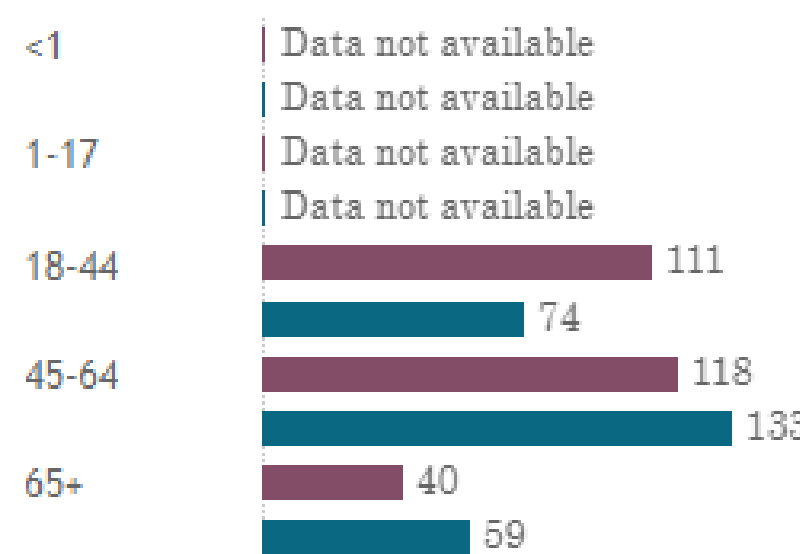

**Emergency Room and Inpatient Over Time**

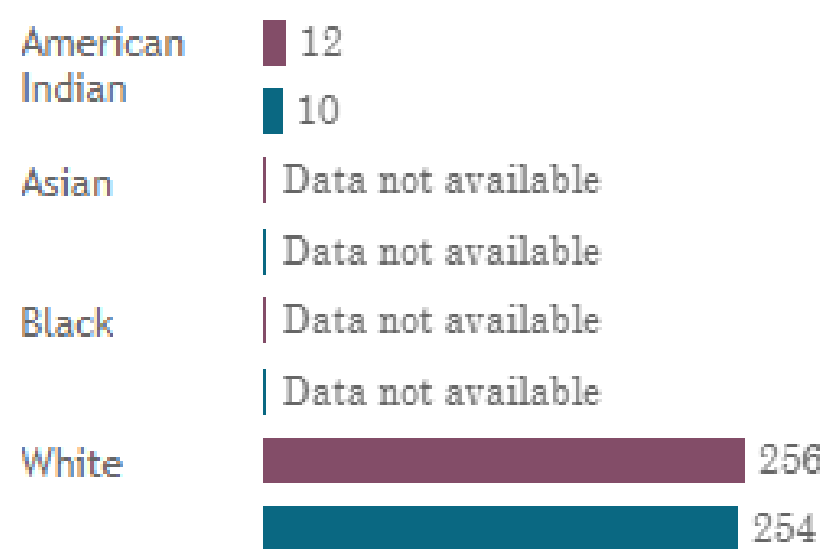

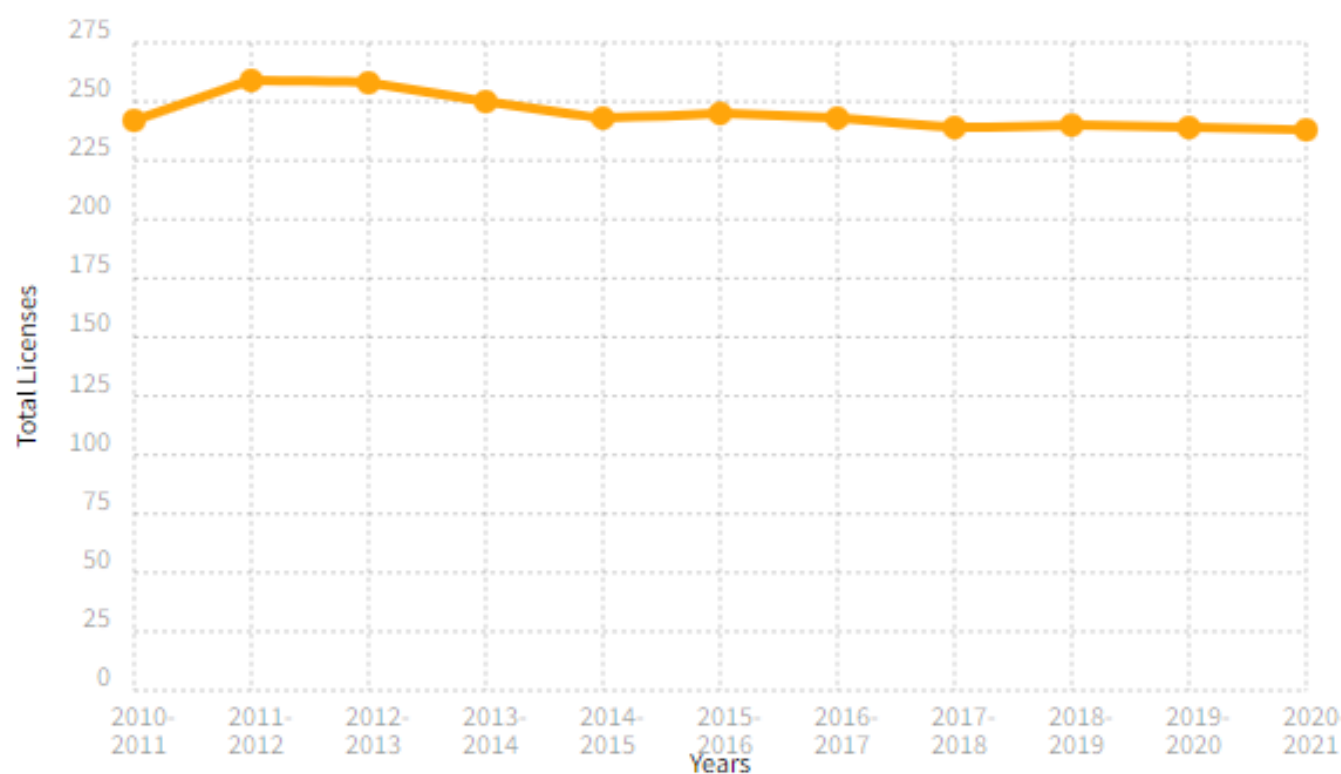

**Retail licenses are categorized by the type of alcohol beverages sold and whether the alcohol beverages are consumed on or off premises.**

- **"Type A"** - fermented malt beverage licenses allow retail sale of fermented malt beverages (beer) for consumption off the premises. Examples: grocery or convenience stores.
- **"Type A"** - liquor licenses allow retail sale of intoxicating liquor (including wine) for consumption off the premises. Examples: liquor stores or grocery stores with full liquor sales sections
- **"Type A"** - (cider only) licenses allow retail sale of cider (any alcohol beverage made from the fermentation of the juice of apples or pears and that contains not less than 0.5% alcohol by volume and not more than 7% alcohol by volume) for consumption off the premises.
- **"Type B"** - fermented malt beverage licenses allow retail sale of fermented malt beverages (beer) for consumption on or off the premises. Examples: restaurants, "beer bars."
- **"Type B"** - liquor licenses allow retail sale of intoxicating liquor (including wine) for consumption on the premises, and wine in original sealed containers for consumption off the premises.
- **"Type C"** - wine licenses allow the sale of wine for consumption only on the premises and allow the carryout of a single opened (resealed) bottle if sold with a meal.

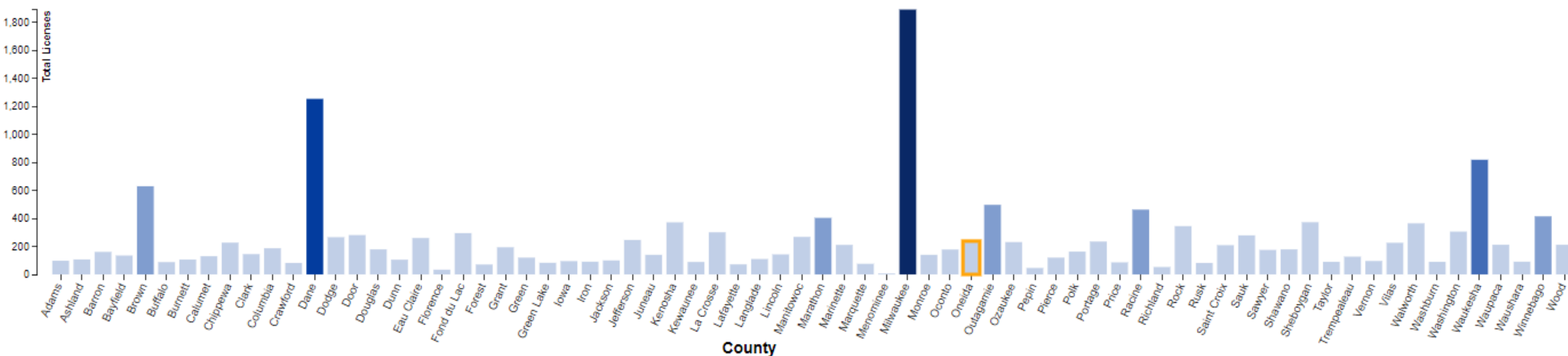

- Need more peer recovery coaches
- Increasing funding for treatment/recovery services
- Increase post-services for AODA treatment

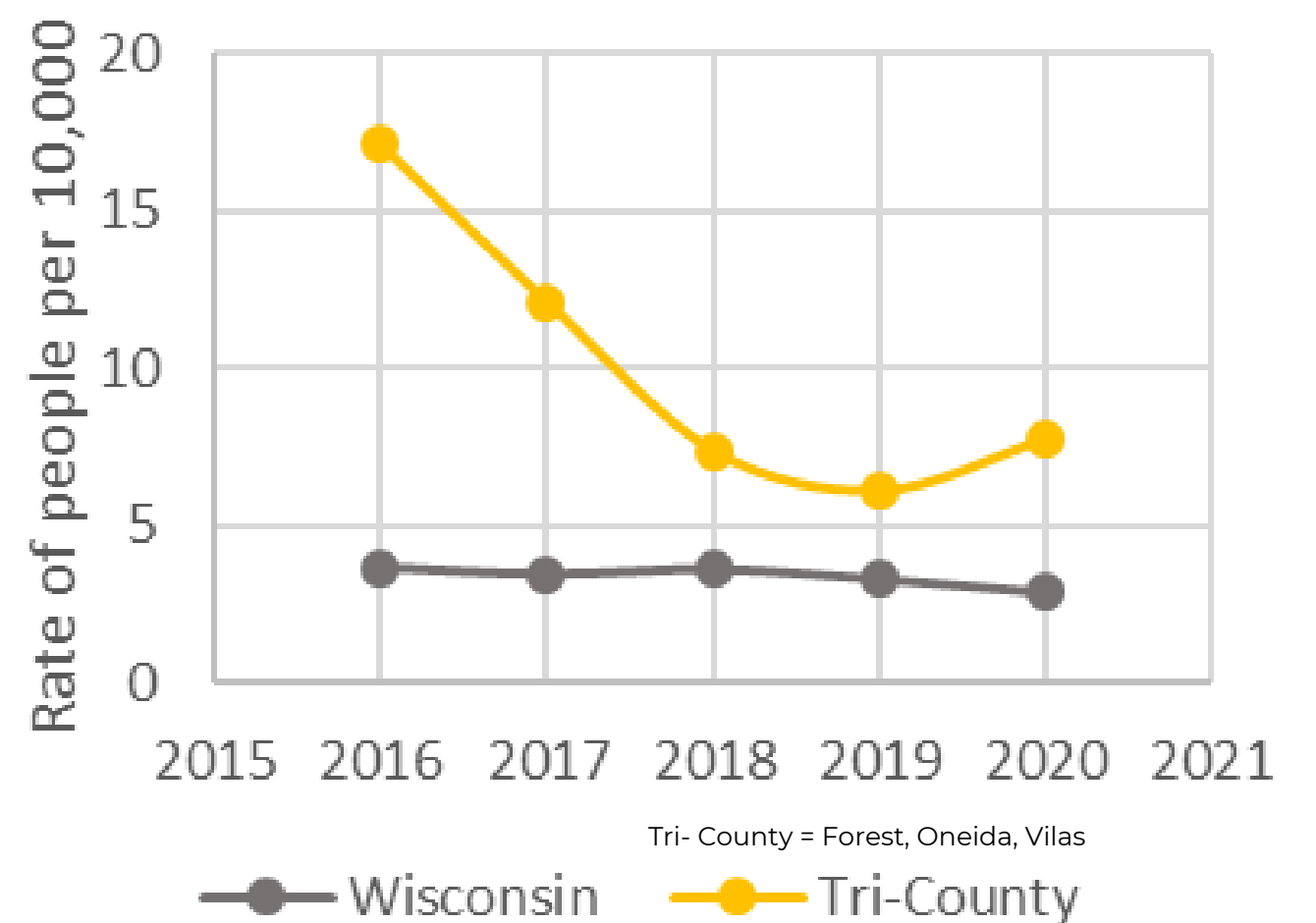

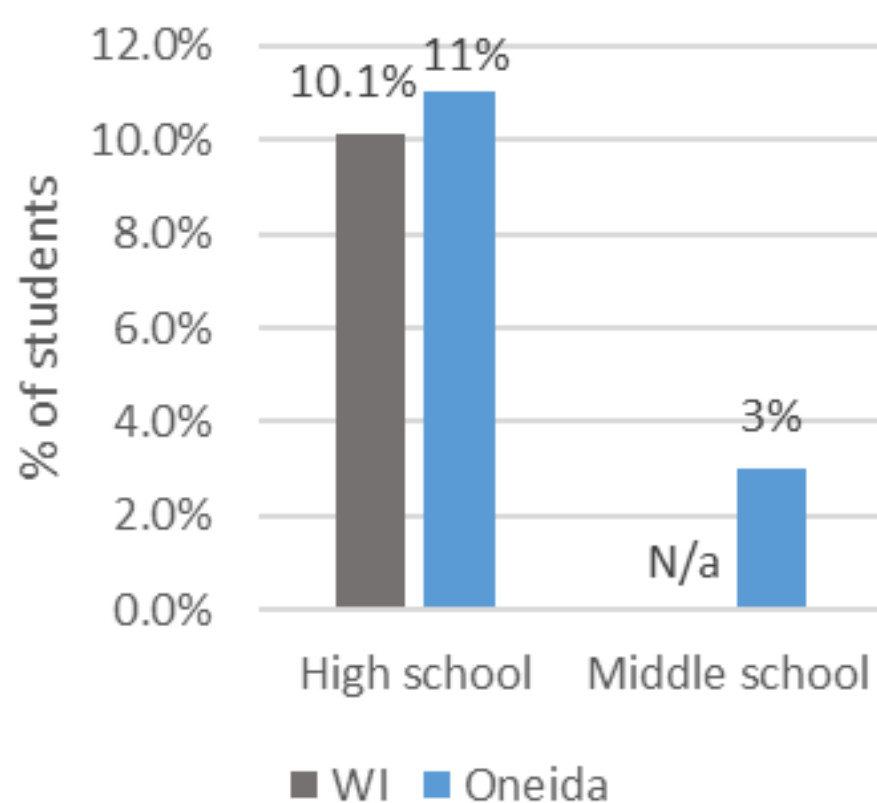
### Opioid treatment



Tri-County = Forest, Oneida, Vilas

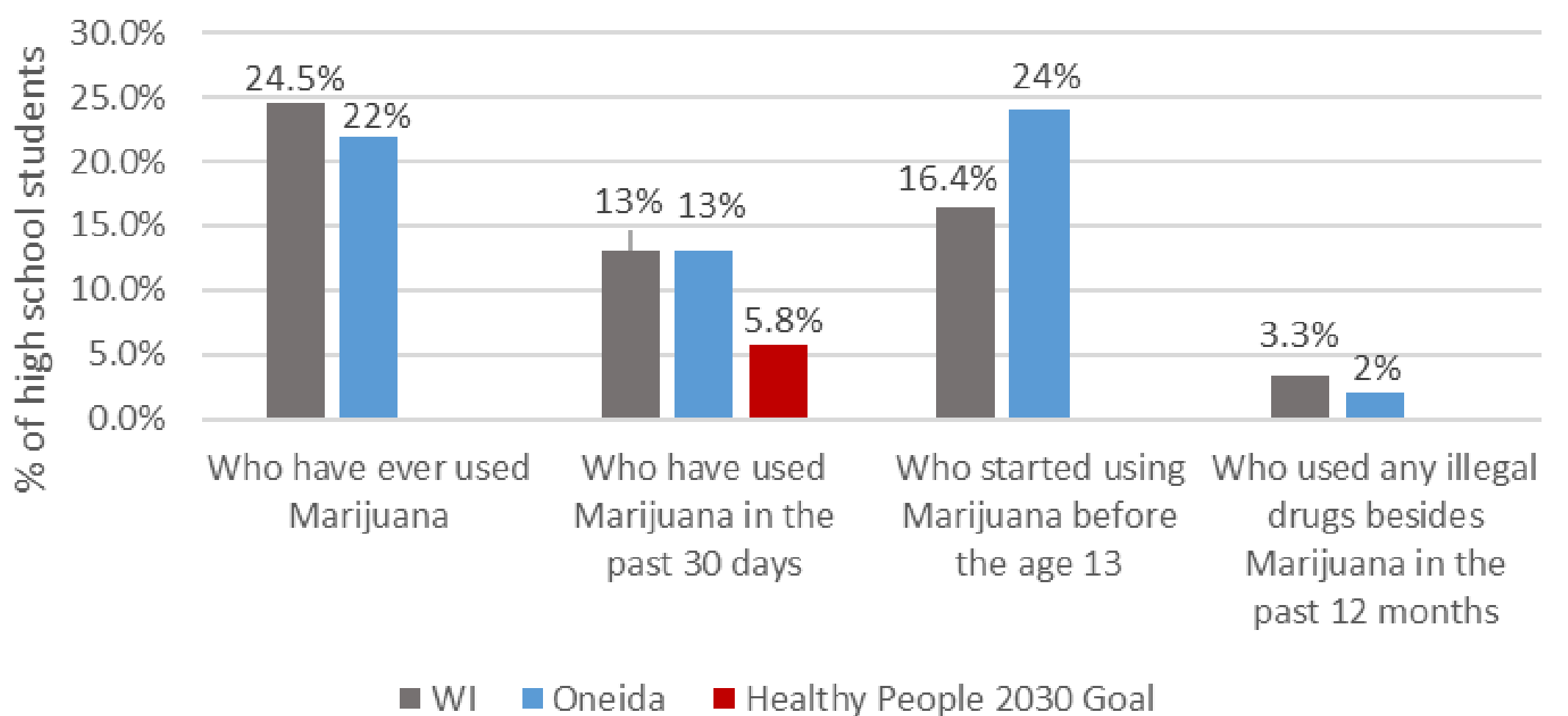

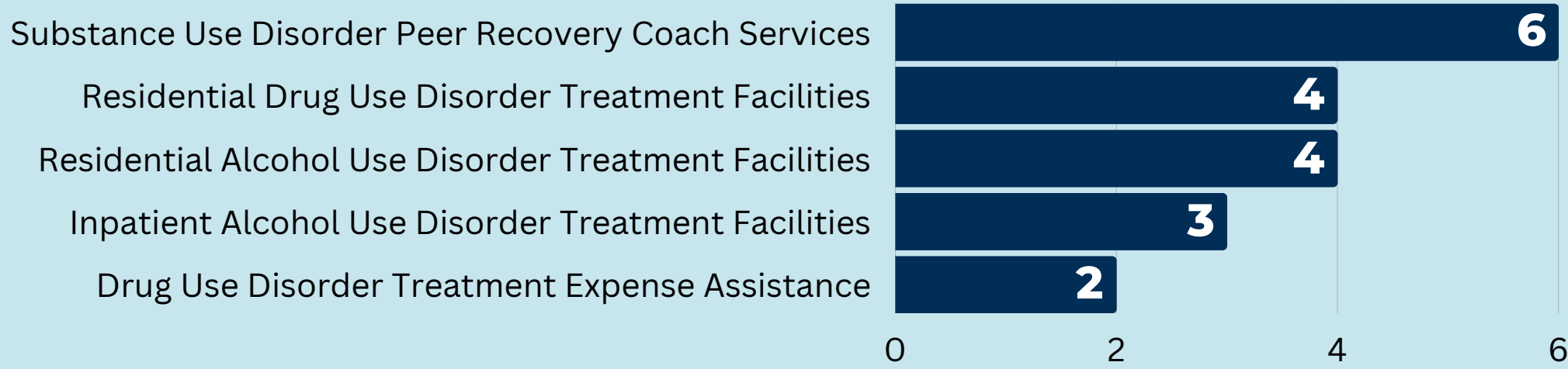
### High School Marijuana Data



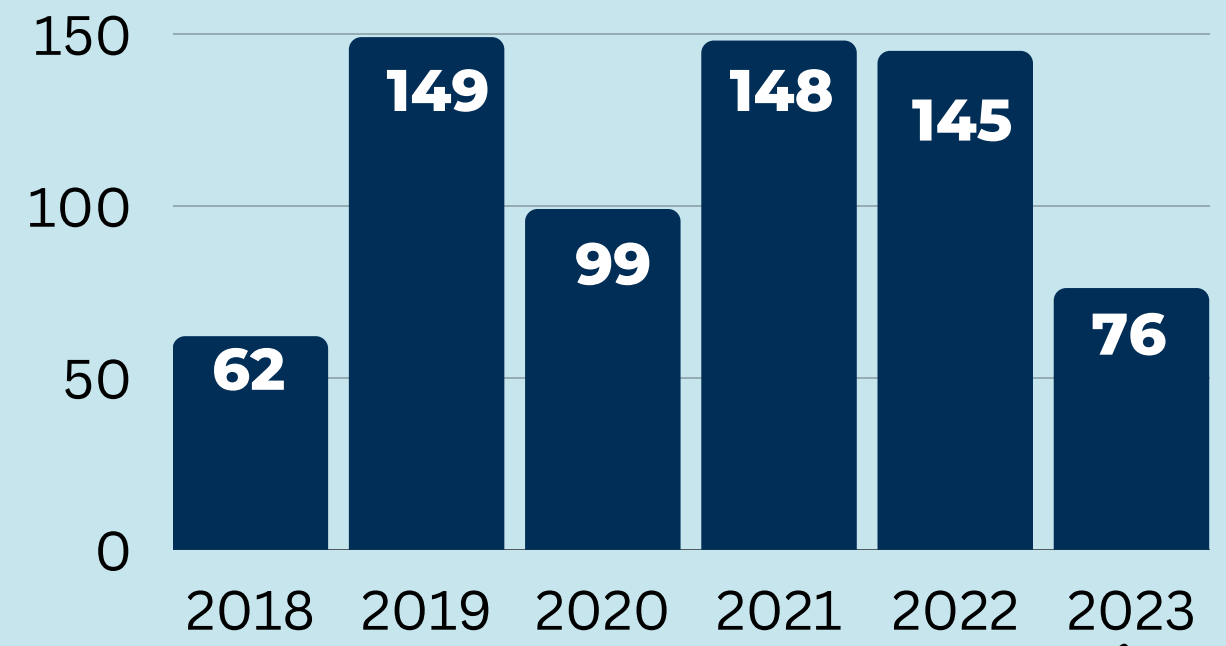

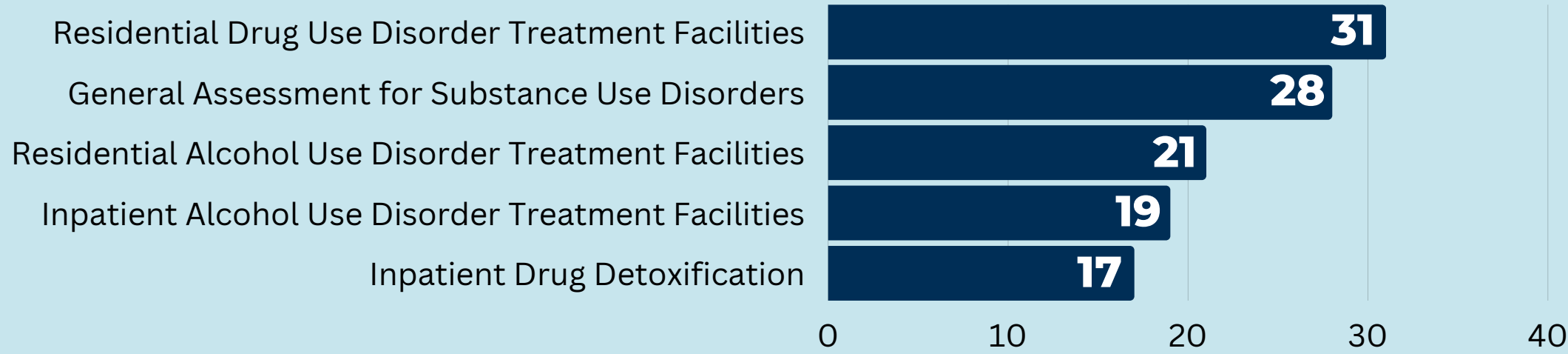
## Oneida County Substance Use: Referrals by Year

**Referral:** A connection made between a client & a particular community service to meet a client's need(s)

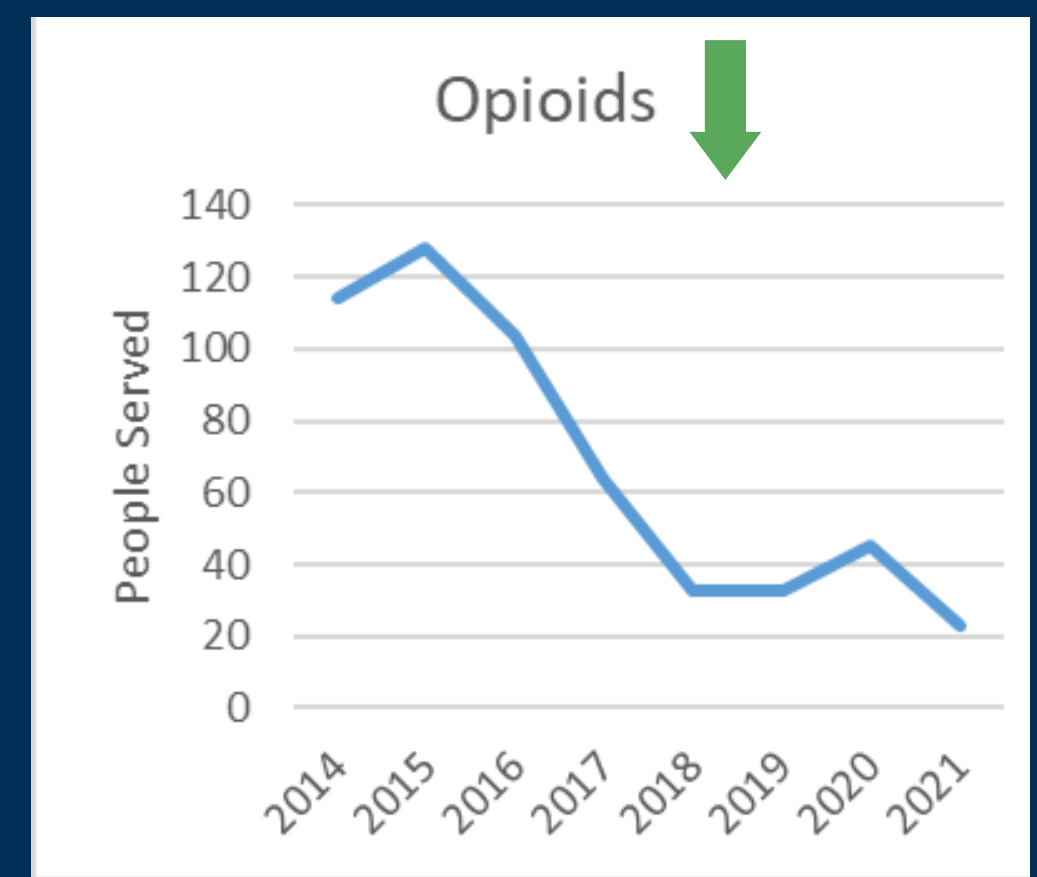
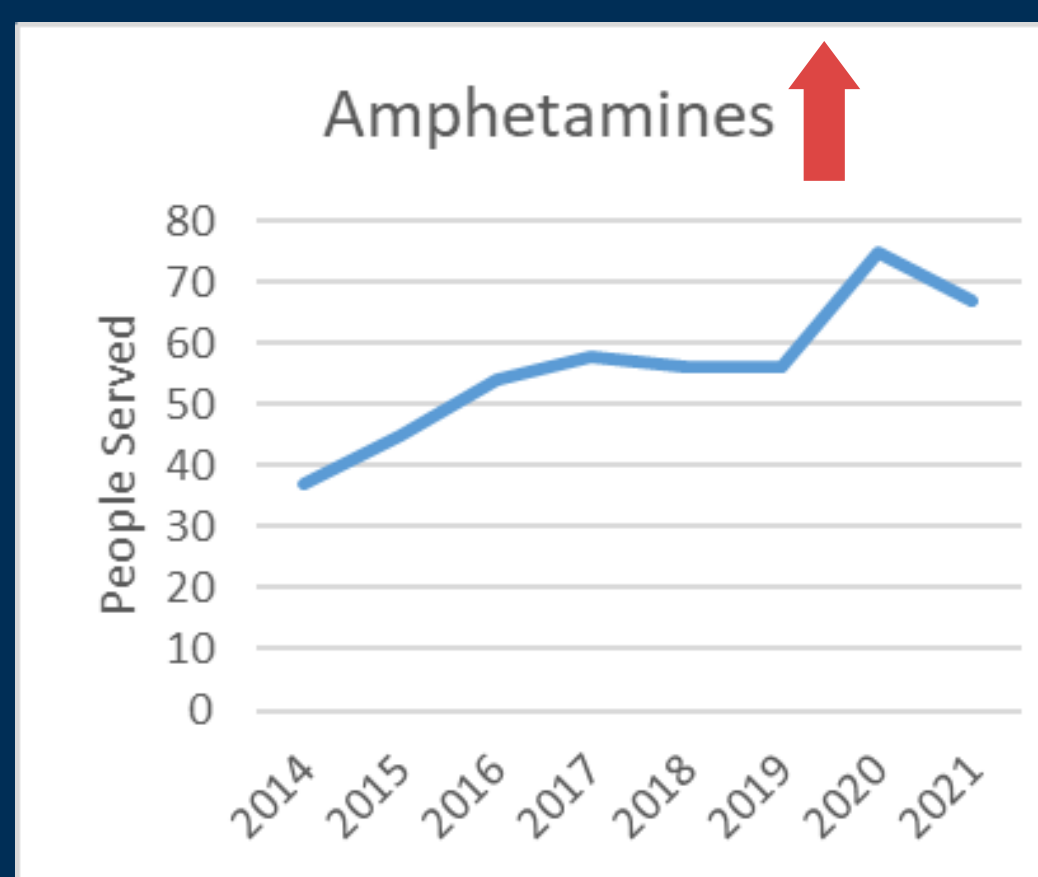
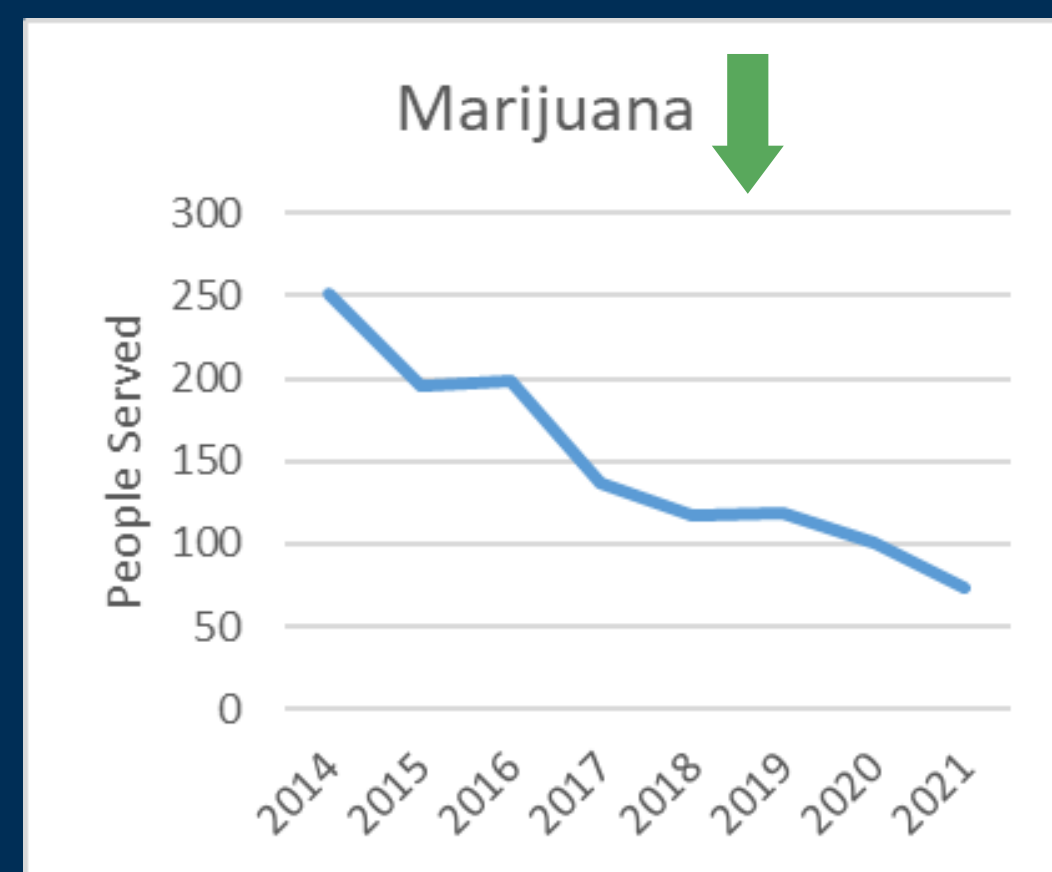
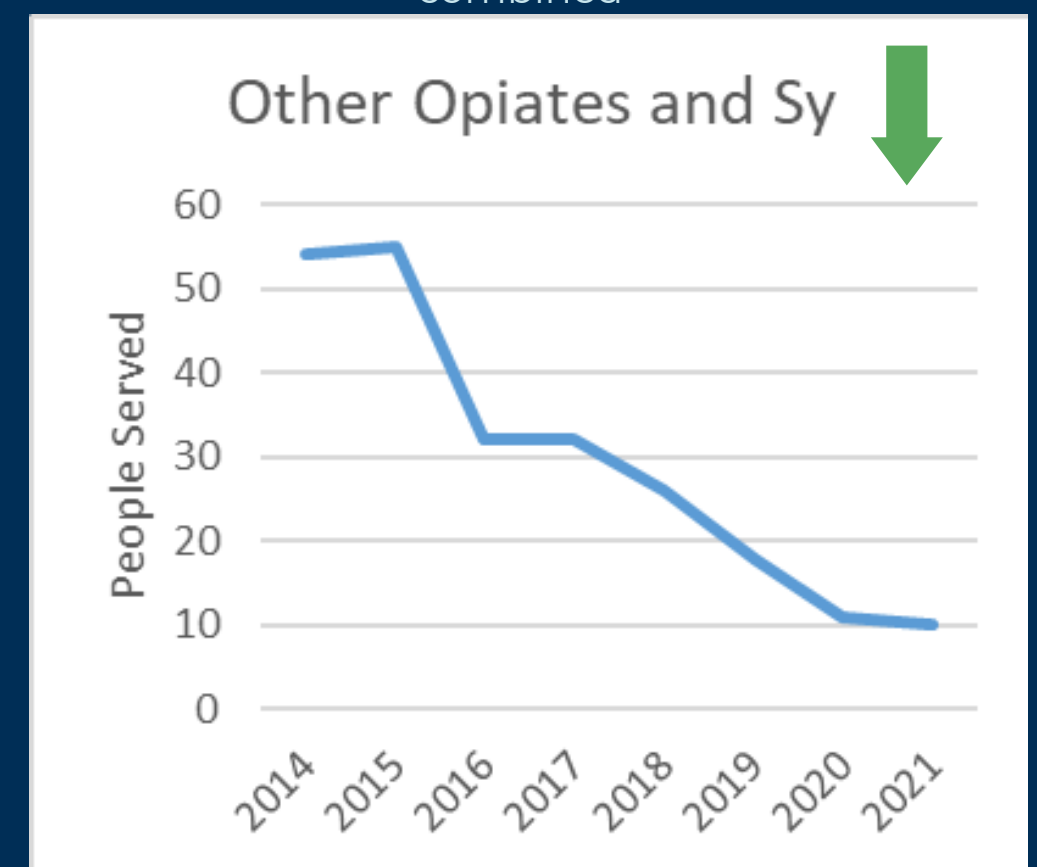
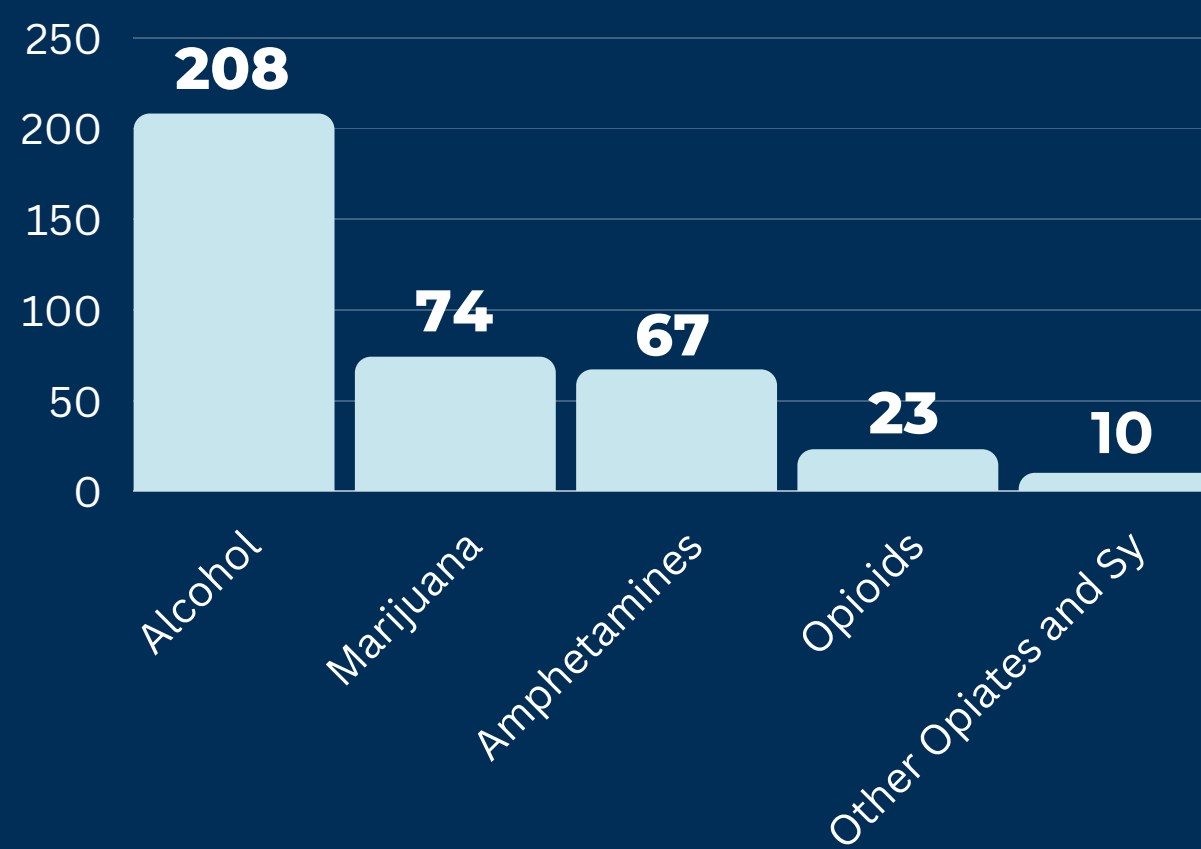
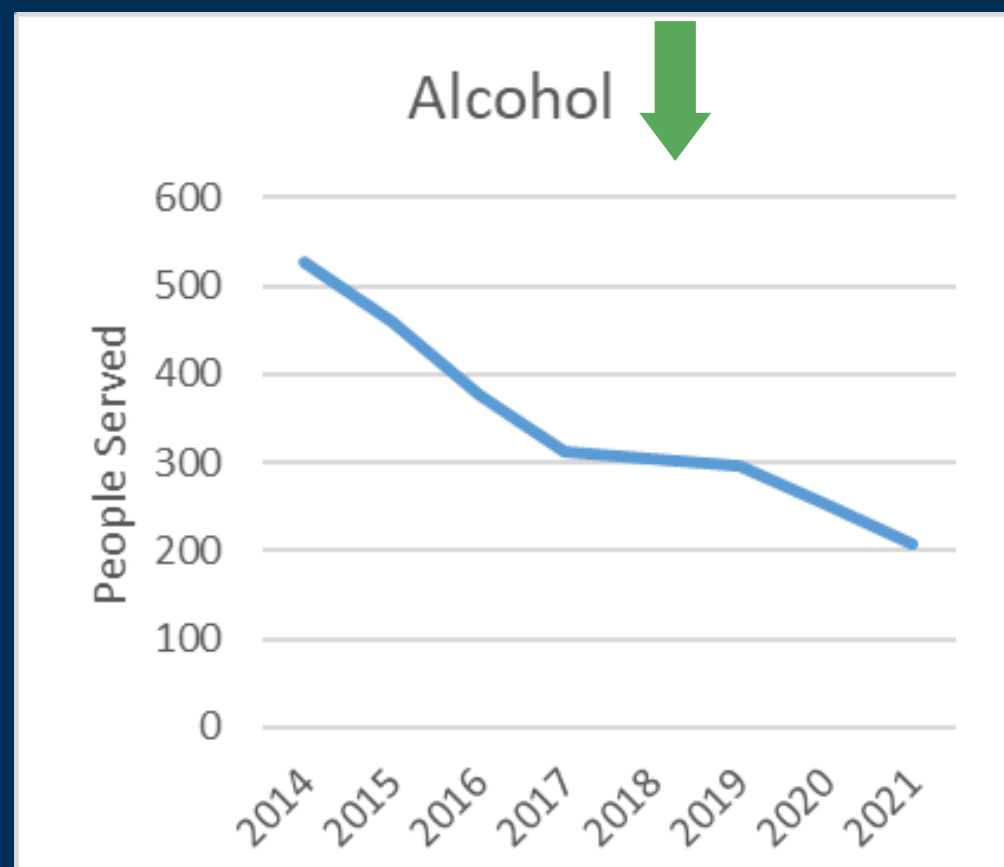
