**Poor Mental Health
Among Youth**

51% of HS students
55% of MS students
Experience significant
problems with anxiety past
12 months (YRBS 2021)

Root Cause

Bullying

31% of HS students
63% of MS students
Experience bullying either
at school, online or in both
forums (YRBS 2021)

**Low Levels of
Adult Support**

14% of HS students do not
have an adult they can turn
to for support (YRBS 2021)

Local Conditions

**Youth are bullied
for the clothes they
wear or who they
hang-out with**

8 of 11 youth report that youth
are bullied for the clothes they
wear or who they hang out with
(focus Group 2023)

**Youth are
experiencing poor
grades and have no
sense of belonging**

70% of HS students report
they receive C's, D's or F's
and have no sense of
belonging (YRBS, 2021)

Housing

Problem

Too many Oneida Co Residents experience housing instability

#1 top area for improvement
CHA survey 2023
(Community Health Assessment Survey, 2023)

Root Cause

Affordability

21.7% households spend 30% of income
9% households spend 50% of income
(Grow North Region Housing Survey, 2017-2021)

Quality

10% of households experience at least 1 of 4 housing problems.
(County Health Rankings & Roadmaps, 2015-2019)

Local Conditions

People are living in overcrowded situations

7.6% of residents are staying with friends or family. (Community Health Assessment, 2023)

People are unhoused and/or are at risk of losing their home

1.4% residents are living in temporary shelters. 13.5% residents are concerned with not having stable housing in the next 3 months. (Community Health Assessment Survey, 2023)

People are living in unsafe residences

19.8% of residents experienced structural/plumbing/electrical/heating problems in the past 12 months. (Community Health Assessment Survey, 2023)

People are not able to repair their homes because they can't find help

11% residents say they need help with repairs. 13% of residents say they want a resource center to answer housing questions. (Community Health Assessment, 2023)

Childcare

Problem

Too many Oneida County Residents are having challenges finding childcare

#2 top area for improvement

Root Cause

Affordability

The average household spent 29% of its income on child care for two children.
(County Health Rankings & Roadmaps, 2021-2022)

Access

From birth to 5 years old care, current full day care capacity is 390, the potential need is 1190, and the current gap is 800.
(Oneida County Childcare Coalition Survey, 2023)

Local Conditions

Parents stay at home because they can't find affordable childcare

2 out of 10 Oneida County employees that a partner/spouse does not work full time (or work less than fulltime) to care for children.
(Oneida County Childcare Coalition Survey, 2023)

Parents are not able to find locations that will accept subsidies

Community Conversation: Health Prioritization – requested information on how many facilities accept subsidies.

Parents are missing work because they do not have childcare

7 out of 10 employees reported having being absent from work due to childcare in the past year.
(Oneida County Childcare Coalition Survey, 2023)

Parents are not able to find childcare locations that can care for child with special needs

Community Conversation: Health Prioritization, identified limited locations to take special needs children as a potential issue.

Parents are not able to enter the workforce part time because there are limited part time childcare options

4 out of 15 childcare facilities offer part time childcare in Oneida County.
(WI Child Care Regulatory System, 2023)

Oneida County adults are at risk of developing unhealthy drinking habits

28% Oneida County adults reported binge drinking or heavy drinking. (County Health Rankings & Roadmaps, 2020)

Adults are consuming alcohol at youth focused events

Access

There are locations to buy alcohol throughout the county

Outlet density, 238 total licenses in Oneida County. (Environmental Public Health Data Tracker, 2020-2021)

8 of 12 Key Informant Interviews stated that AODA was one of their clients most pressing health concerns

Parents allow youth to consume alcohol with parental supervision

35% of high school students had their first drink before the age of 13. (YRBS, 2021)
