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Stay Protected: Get Your Flu and COVID Vaccines in November

As the weather turns colder and we transition into the holiday season, Oneida County Health Department (OCHD) wants to remind you it is not too late to get your flu or COVID vaccine. November is a great time to make sure your loved ones and your community are safeguarded against these illnesses.

Oneida County Health Department (OCHD) is dedicated to ensuring that everyone in our community has access to flu and COVID-19 vaccines and offers:

- ✓ **Bridge Access Program:** Provides COVID-19 vaccines to adults without health insurance and adults whose insurance does not cover all COVID-19 vaccine costs.
- ✓ **Vaccines for Adults (VFA):** Helps with flu vaccines for uninsured or underinsured adults 19 and older.
- ✓ **Transportation Assistance:** Provides rides to and from community clinics for people who do not have their own transportation or have trouble getting there.
- ✓ **Drive-up Vaccines:** For those individuals who may have limited mobility and would prefer a vaccine from their vehicle.
- ✓ **Home Visits:** For those individuals that have an acute or chronic illness, limited mobility, injury, developmental disability, or mental health condition that makes it difficult to leave the home.

Protect yourself and your loved ones – November is a great time to get your flu and COVID vaccines.

OCHD clinic hours are Monday – Friday, 8:30am-4:00pm, located at 100 W Keenan St., Rhinelander, WI 54501. Appointments are not required.
